Selective Service

Draft = when you have to serve in the armed forces by law

World War I started in Europe in 1914.

The United States entered the war in 1916.

In 1917, the U.S. passed the Selective Service Act.

The Selective Service Act gave the president the power to **draft** soldiers.

Currently, being a part of the U.S. armed forces is voluntary but there is a law that allows the U.S. government to draft soldiers.

Selective Service registration is required for men between the ages 18 through 25. It is the law.
