Instructions

This is a fun board game for all ages to learn more about famous Americans. To review or learn more about the famous Americans in the game, please click on the image or name of each famous American.

Materials Needed

If you are accessing this activity from the USCIS [Citizenship Resource Center](#), then you will need a printer.

- Die 
- Small objects or pieces of paper to use as player markers

To Play

- The object of the game is to get to the finish line first, answering questions along the way.
- Let each player roll the die. The player with the highest number starts.
- Each player must say one thing about the famous American on the square they land on. If they can say one thing about why the person is famous, then they can move on to that square, otherwise they remain on their current square.
- The player who reaches the finish line wins!


